- Generous grant... and no tuition fees!
















Credit mobility: how does it work?

• Step 1: Find the right partner (HEI) to set the inter-institutional agreement;

Step 2: Inter-institutional agreements to set mobility flows - signed before mobilities start;

(Negotiate the number of sending and receiving students and staff; recognition of study period & credits)

• Step 3: Programme Countries HEI can apply to its Erasmus+ National Agency.

EUR 350/participant



Individual support

EUR 700-900/month for students and EUR 140-180/day for staff



Contribution to travel costs

EUR 20-1500, depending on distance travelled






