- Improve the quality and responsiveness of VET to economic and social developments to enhance the labour market relevance of skills provision;

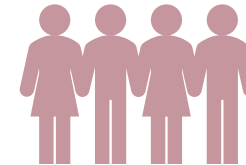

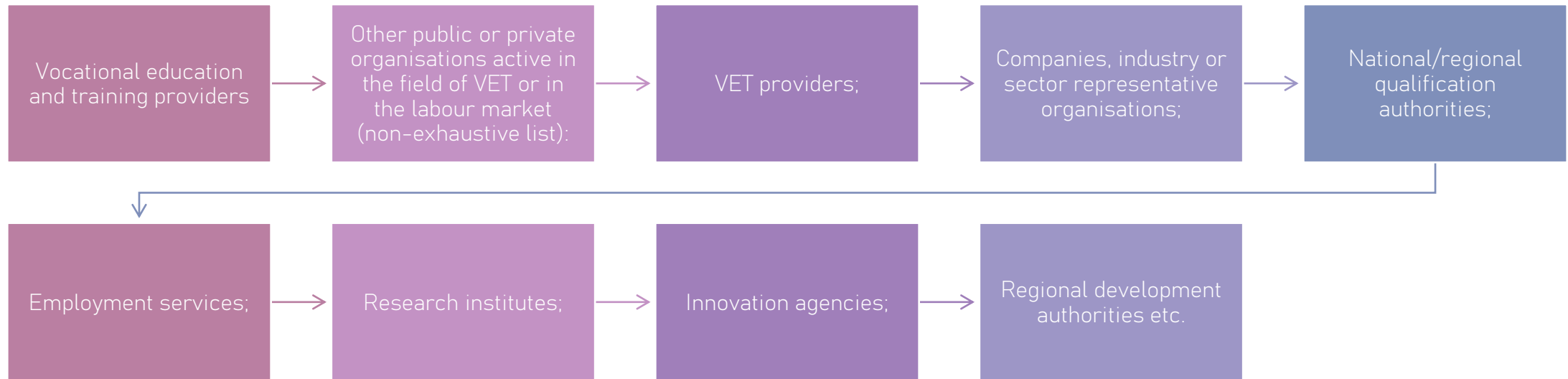

Any public and private organisation active in the VET field and legally established in an EU Member State or eligible third country associated to the Programme.

03

Organisations from third countries not associated to the Programme cannot be coordinators.

04

Cross-regional projects are not eligible.

05

"Multiple submissions" are now possible (one organisation can submit more than 1 application)

Financial mechanism – Lump Sum Type II

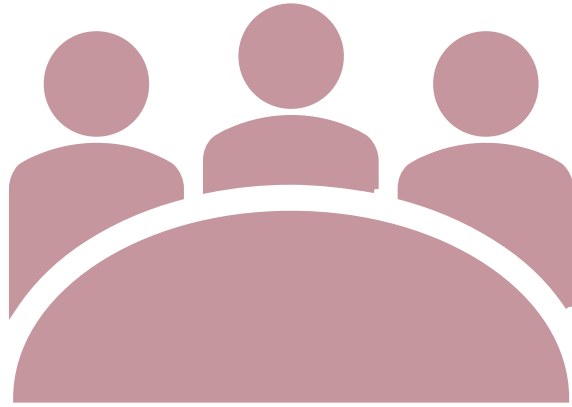
Funding rules are set in the Erasmus+ Programme Guide

EU grant is maximum 80% of the estimated budget.

Maximum EU grant: 400 000 EUR

Minimum EU grant: 100 000 EUR

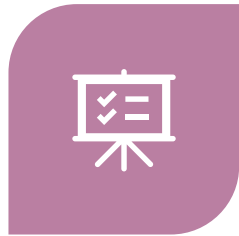
20% – Contribution from sources other than the EU grant (own resources, financial contributions from third parties or income generated by the project)



What makes a good project?

-
- Consortium composition (including players in VET, world of work, decision makers)
 - Clear needs analysis (for the region/countries, for your partners, for your participants)
 - Realistic impact (explaining what will your project change in VET, concise objectives)
 - Concrete outputs and deliverables (clearly supporting capacity in VET)
 - In line with policy documents and regional priorities (see Programme Guide)
 - Balanced EU grant (remember: focus is on third countries not associated to Programme)

PROJECTS WHICH HAVE DONE AN IMPACTFUL NEEDS ANALYSIS HAVE A MORE FOCUSED/EASIER IMPLEMENTATION



PROJECTS WHICH DELIVER IMPACT FOR THE LEARNERS ARE PARTICULARLY OF INTEREST FOR FEEDBACK TO POLICY



IMPACTFUL DELIVERABLES (RATHER QUALITY THAN QUANTITY)



REPORTING PERIODS (RPS) ARE CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATION AND DO NOT NEED DELIVERABLE ON IT



MILESTONES IN BETWEEN MONTH 1 – 18 AND 20 – 36, TO ACCOMPLISH THE RPS

Feedback from monitoring

Communication/Dissemination/stakeholder engagement starts as of day one: cover it in the proposal and 2-3 deliverables accompanying the implementation.

Partner constellations: Big consortia are more difficult to manage; those consortia which manage to establish already at proposal-stage a thorough and detailed collaboration have it easier in the implementation.

Useful tips



Be coherent: avoid contradictions and “cut and paste” style applications



Be concrete: use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence



Be clear: read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form



Be explicit: take nothing for granted; don't assume that experts have prior knowledge; avoid abbreviations or explain them



Be realistic: the application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign



Remain focused: concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you



Eligibility: make sure you have followed all instructions and that the proposal meets all mandatory requirements



Keep it simple: use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused
